Book report: After you have read both books decide which one you would like to do your book report on.

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory

or

Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing

Project is due on the first day of school

Your task is to create a milk carton display providing information on a given topic of nonfiction study. Each side of the carton will display a written description of a major component of your studies, along with an illustration.

Directions:

1. You will need a clean, four-sided juice/milk carton.
2. Decorate your carton using white, or colored paper (if paper has a pattern, just make sure it is not a busy pattern).
3. Write the title of your project on a strip of paper (some type of heavy-weight paper is best) and glue it to the top of the carton. Write your name on the bottom of the carton.
4. Plan out the space on each side of the carton so you will have room for a label, a description, and an illustration.
5. Create labels for each side of the carton and glue them on.
6. Write a description of each of the four topics and glue these on.
7. Create illustrations for each description and glue them on.
8. Punch a hole in the pouring spout of the carton and thread string or yarn through it. Cartons will be hung for display in class.

____ panel 1 (10 points) Title of book, author's name, summary, and illustration.

____ panel 2 (10 points) Describe the setting of the book, include illustration.

____ panel 3 (10 points) Describe two characters from the story. Include their physical appearance and describe their personality. Include illustration.

____ panel 4 (10 points) Favorite part of the story. Include and illustration.

____ correct use of grammar, spelling, punctuation, capitalization, complete sentences (10 points)

____ neat/attractive presentation (5 points). Please use pen, colored pencils and/or markers. No pencil.
